The dawn of the New Year comes with its own challenges. Despite the progress we have made,

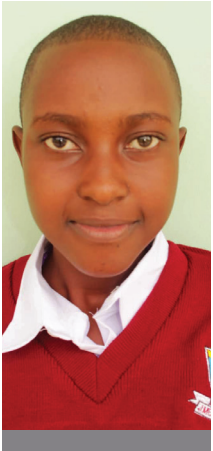

A great number of people in the world do not have access to the basic necessity that so many of us take for granted; good clean water. We offer a solution to East African villages and since 1976 we have drilled over 700 wells throughout the country of Tanzania giving the people good clean water.

We drill a well 50 to 100 m deep. Finding water, a windmill or an electric pump run by a generator is used. Water is stored in two constructed water tanks, holding up to 3000L of water. The cost of all this has risen and is now at \$45,000. This year we hope to put five more water systems in five villages.

Help us give these people a chance to better their lives with good clean water. We acknowledge the difficulty to be concerned with lives of those who are so far removed from us. But with your help, we can help provide water wells for the villages and communities without.

Water will keep these communities healthy as they will have clean water to drink, clean water to practice hygiene and in turn protect themselves from deadly diseases like E.coli and cholera. The global reality of COVID-19 has compounded the urgent need for clean water and sanitation/hand washing facilities.



STATISTICS ABOUT THE WATER PROJECT IN TANZANIA

WELLS IN GOOD CONDITION



Villages and communities need an adequate water supply that is available at a constant and dependable supply. When a well is built, a constant maintenance is necessary to ensure a continuous, safe supply of water.

YEARLY SPENDING ON MAINTANANCE



24% (\$131,607.521 of the Water Project's budget (\$548,364.67) was used on maintaining wells and replacing equipments.

WE EXPECT THE COST TO RISE



We anticipate the maintenance cost to double in the next 2 years because increased water usage as a result of population growth, aging wells and equipments, human activities such as construction and farming, and climatic conditions could affect water supply.

TANZANIA, MORE THAN JUST A TRIP TO THE SAFARI

I first learned of CPPS Mission Projects when a university classmate spoke about his experience in Tanzania and the work done by the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. I was intrigued by what he said and felt prompted to sponsor him.

A few months later, I travelled, along with several other university students, to spend a weekend at St. Alphonsus. We stuffed envelopes for the fundraising mail campaign and put together medical supplies and clothing boxes for shipment to Tanzania. I met Brother Anthony Canterucci, a dear friend and the Mission Director for CPPS that weekend and felt I had found my 'tribe'.

IN THE SUMMER OF 1983, I MADE THE TRIP TO TANZANIA WHERE I MET MY HUSBAND, FRANK. WE WERE MARRIED THE NEXT SUMMER WITH PLANS TO RETURN AS A LAY MISSIONARY COUPLE AFTER I COMPLETED TEACHER'S COLLEGE. GOD HAD OTHER PLANS.

In the summer of 1983, I made the trip to Tanzania where I met my husband, Frank. We were married the next summer with plans to return as a lay missionary couple after I completed Teacher's College. God had other plans. We welcomed four children into our family and our plans to return to Tanzania were put on hold. We continued to attend fundraising events with our children who especially loved the spaghetti dinners at St. Alphonsus.

Our family moved to Kamloops, BC in the summer of 1998. At the invitation of the Diocese of Kamloops, Brother Anthony travelled to our Catholic schools

and shared the story of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. Since that time, our group of volunteers in Kamloops has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars to support the work of CPPS Mission Projects. We have sent ten groups of volunteers to work in the mission field, including two lay missionaries who each served there for more than two years.

It has been an amazing journey that changed the trajectory of our family's life. The Missionaries of the Precious Blood include some of my dearest friends and remain, to this day, models of faith and love in action.

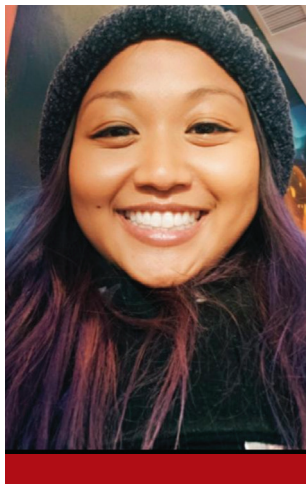

We are so proud and happy to announce that our students at Venerable John Merlini Secondary School took the National Exams in 2021 and performed exceptionally well. Out of the 101 students who took the exam, 81 graduated with distinction (division I) and 20 scored division II, improving the school's ranking from 4th place in the previous year to 2nd place out of 187 schools within the region of Dodoma! Nation-wide the school ranked 68 out of 4,141 schools.

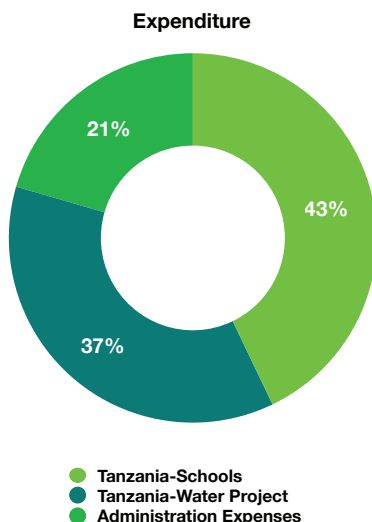

Endowment Fund

A GIFT THAT KEEPS ON GIVING

Together we have built two renowned schools in Tanzania (St. Gaspar Primary and John Merlini Secondary) which provide education to 1500 students a year. The future of these mission schools is both exciting and challenging. It is exciting because the schools are performing outstandingly well. We are confident it is not a matter of if, but when graduates from our schools will go on to become catalysts for development in their communities. And it is challenging because the excellence we are achieving comes at a great cost, about \$766,942.42 CAD a year. What will happen to the schools when it becomes difficult to fund them from fundraising initiatives and appeals? A strong endowment is a consistent source of aid and a critical component to provide stability to our schools and will continue to empower children in need, to be the difference in the world and communities, far into the future.

Donating to an endowment fund is one of the most impactful ways to ensure sustainability and afford the mission schools the opportunity to plan strategically for the long term. This fund is meant to be permanent whereby the principal of the gift is invested and a portion of the investment income is used annually to fund specific initiatives. Providing for the long term financial success of the organization, it will also serve as a buffer in times of financial and/or fundraising reversals.



The overall objective is to achieve an annual realized income that provides both spending and inflation protection. It is necessary to protect the endowment against inflation and preserve capital, not only for current needs, but for future needs as well.



The Mission committee and Board of Directors exercise general oversight of the financial affairs of the Mission Projects; reviews investment policies, objectives and strategies; reviews the portfolio and performance of the fund.

You will receive a tax receipt for the amount of the gift. We will receive a gift of capital, which we will protect and place it in investment portfolio. The gift will provide an ongoing income for our projects in perpetuity.

Our work is not just about building the capacity of the schools to provide a safe environment and quality education, it also about improving the capacity of the students to learn. Without food at school some children would choose to stay at home, while those at school would go through the day learning on an empty stomach or be forced to walk home at lunchtime in the hope of finding a meal, severely

impacting on both their well-being and their learning. With 1500 children to feed three meals a day, our feeding programme is a significant financial undertaking.

The total cost amounts to around 12000 USD per month, depending on food prices. Please help us remove hunger as a barrier to learning. Support this program today.

TEXT BOOKS

A lack of access to up-to-date textbooks and learning resources can hinder children's leaning capacity. You helped us build a library, now help us equip the library with up-to-date text books and help our students study and learn with excellence. \$40 will equip a child with much needed text books.

COMPUTERS

The world is well into the Fourth Industrial Revolution shaped by information technology. It is a fact computer skills necessary for Africa to transform itself into a continent of growth and opportunity. If young people do not learn how to use and create with technology, the continent is sure to fall further behind. We want to equip our students with basic tech proficiency and, going further, enable students to create with technology. Certainly, many constraints exist, including funding for equipment and lack of trained teachers. Our goal is to buy 200 computers this year. \$100 at a time will bring us closer to reaching our goal!
